

The Polar Express...

Taking my son Tom to see Polar Express organised by the ENAS had seemed like a very good idea in the planning. As the day of the show drew nearer I became a bit anxious. I'd never been to St. Mark's before, so didn't know what the parking would be like in the area. I began to fret about how Tom would be with the other children. I needn't have worried. Parking was easy, Tom had a great time ...and so did I.

St. Mark's hall was looking lovely, full of festive cheer, and there was a welcoming, relaxed atmosphere from the volunteer organisers. Tea, coffee and soft drinks were available for everyone. Popcorn (sweet and salt), luxury chocolate biscuits had been laid on. There were some seats set out towards the back of the hall, but most of the children (and adults) chose to sit on the floor at the front snuggling into cushions, duvets and blankets that they had brought with them.

The children, Tom included, seemed to really enjoy watching the film in the company of other children. Most of them had seen it before but it didn't seem to lessen their enjoyment. Observations were spoken from the dark, plenty of squeals of excitement heard and when a child became restless and needed to let of a little steam there was room to move about and not disturb others. A truly magical afternoon and for me it is when Christmas began.


PAWS – Parents Autism Workshops & Support

Representing Our Members -Enfield Autism Steering Groups

One of our main aims as a local branch of the NAS is to represent the needs of people on the autistic spectrum and their parents and carers to policy makers in the Local Authority. We aim to act as a catalyst, prompting policy and decision makers to improve the services for our families, children and young people in Enfield. With the change of administration in the Council and the Autism Act being implemented there are some changes in our activities.

The work of Education Steering Group has been taken over by the new Early Intervention Thematic Group. Feedinginto this group will be results of the Audit of Autism Provision in Enfield that the specialist EPs Claire Lokke and Sally Maidens carried out last year. Many of you will have spoken with Claire and Sally either at one of branch meetings or at one of the coffee mornings. There is now a working group reviewing their report and developing in action plan. We are part of that working group.
